From Wilderness to Mountain

1 Kings 19:8 **"So Elijah got up and ate and drank. Strengthened by that food, he traveled forty days** and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God."


For the past month we have seen taking a deep dive into the life and prophetic ministry of Elijah. In Chapter 19 we have literally and symbolically both wilderness and mountain in Elijahs life. Life is composed of those experiences and encounters which provide both challenges to one's character and the testing on one's spirit. To be sure, life is not only composed of experiences and encounters; it is also composed of serious questions. In every life there are always questions which ought to be asked and which ought to require an answer. The first core question of life is: "Who am I?" and the second question is like it, "What am I living for?"

When life has been lived to a level of maturity, when a persons experiences and encounters have led to some ups and downs, some joys and sadnesses—there is yet another question that a person will often ask themselves: "How did I get where I am which is so far from where I am supposed to be?" One has wisely said that there are three kinds of people in the world: those who are in the wilderness, those who have just come out of the wilderness, and those who are headed into the wilderness. In the midst of such a wilderness experience, God sends an angel to feed Elijah. "Get up and eat, for the journey is too much for you..."

Elijah may well have thought "What journey? I am through. I am all washed up—I am burned out" –But God's message was "You're not through, Elijah—I am going to send you from where you are to where I want you to be. I am going to send you from molehill to the mountain—from the wilderness to the mountain."

If you follow the journey of Elijah, we know in the wilderness there was drain and weakness, but on the mountain where God would lead there came strength, perspective and resolve. In the wilderness there was complete loneliness, but on the mountain, there is felt companionship with God. In the wilderness there is despair, but on the mountain is hope. Whether we find ourselves in the wilderness or on the mountain God reveals himself and offers sustenance.



The current flag was designed by a 17-year-old

Our current 50-star flag was designed as part of a <u>high school project</u> by 17-year-old Robert Heft. It was 1958, and there were only 48 states at the time, but Heft had a hunch Hawaii and Alaska would soon be granted statehood. His teacher gave him a B- but went on to update the grade to an A after Heft submitted his design to the White House, eventually leading to a call from President Eisenhower that it had been selected as the official U.S. flag.



They call it Lake Superior for a reason

Everyone knows Lake Superior is big (they don't call it one of the Great Lakes for nothing), but few people know exactly how large it really is. Not only is Lake Superior the largest freshwater <u>lake</u> in the world, but it holds three *quadrillion* gallons of water. That's enough liquid to completely cover both North and South America under a foot of water.

Irene Triplett was the last recipient of an American Civil War pension

The Civil War ended in 1865, but Irene Triplett was still collecting a pension until her passing in 2020. Her father served in the war, which entitled Triplett to a survivor's benefit of \$73.13 a month.

You might be surprised by the oldest city

Many people assume Jamestown, Virginia, is the <u>oldest city</u> in the United States, but the reality is Jamestown is merely the oldest *English* settlement. The oldest city in the United States is actually St. Augustine, Florida. The area was originally claimed for Spain by famed explorer Ponce De Leon in 1513; the United States took control in 1821.

The book believed to be the first-ever to be printed in America was called *Bay Psalm Book*, published way back in 1640. In 2013, one of the 11 copies known to be still in existence sold at auction for \$14.2 million. Needless to say, *Bay Psalm Book* is one of the most expensive books in the world.

Thanksgiving was when?

You may think it's a fact that <u>Thanksgiving</u> was always held on the fourth Thursday of November, but that's not the case. The holiday was held on several different dates until Abraham Lincoln declared in 1863 that it would henceforth be held every year on the fourth Thursday in November. This day was honored by every subsequent president until FDR moved it to the third Thursday of November in 1939, to extend the Christmas season. After many complaints, he realized his mistake and two years later moved it back to the fourth Thursday; that's when we celebrate it today.

The words on the Liberty Bell

Did you know the word Pennsylvania is spelled wrong on the Liberty Bell? Actually, "spelled wrong" is probably a bit harsh: In 1752, when the bell was made, "Pensylvania" was one of several acceptable spellings of the state name.
