Greetings in the Name of our Lord!

Focusing on God's Greatness (Psalm 86, Colossians 3:1-4)

"Only God is great." That was the solemn and unexpected declaration of Jean-Baptiste Massillion as he began his sermon at the funeral of King Louis XIV. King Louis XIV liked to be referred to as Louis the Great. He ruled France from 1643 to 1715 with absolute power and incredible splendor. His funeral was held in a magnificent cathedral that was lit by a single candle alongside the ornate coffin of the King.

When it was time for Massillion to speak, he slowly walked toward the casket, and then reached out and extinguished the candle. Then he broke the shock and silence with the words, "only God is great."

We recognize and admire some of our fellow mortals who are considered to be great: great thinkers, great scientists, great inventors, great athletes, and great achievers in every field of endeavor. In many ways they tower above all of us ordinary people, but they still have the same needs that we do. They experience aches and pains; they have family problems and practical daily challenges. They have troubled minds and hungry hearts that cannot starve off death nor guarantee life beyond the grave. In this sense only God is truly great, great enough to meet all our needs, great enough to forgive all our sins and shortcomings, great enough to carry us through the dark valley of death into eternity, to be with Him forever. So we declare along with the Psalmist "You are great... You alone are God." (Psalm 86:10).

How often, however, we lose sight of God's greatness and become fixated on our limits or flaws, or the weakness of another. We begin living in a cloud of negative self-absorbed thinking. Some years ago, a sociologist accompanied a group of mountian climbers on an expedition. Among other things, he observed a distinct correlation between cloud cover and contentment. When there was no cloud cover and the peak was in view, the climbers were energetic and cooperative. When gray clouds eclipsed the view of the

mountiantop, leaving the mountiantop obscured to sight, feeling unreachable, the climbers were sullen and selfish.

The same thing happens to us. As long as our eyes are on God's goodness, God's majesty and greatness, there seems to be a bounce in our step. But let our eyes focus on the dirt beneath our feet, or the gray dampness of winter, then we grumble and lose our energy. We feel every twinge of pain as we climb up the hill toward the top. For this reason, Paul urges us in Colossians 3:1-2 "so if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on things that are on earth…."





The forty days of Lent are most frequently identified with Jesus' forty-day fast in the wilderness. Other Biblical parallels include the forty days Moses spent on Mt. Sinai, and the forty years that the nation of Isreal wandered in the wilderness.

For many centuries, Lent has been devoted to Christian nurture through discipline and penitence. It is a time for increased reflection and contemplation on the life, the teaching, and the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ. The use of these days for deepening the spiritual life enables Christians to better comprehend Jesus' suffering as well as the measure of God's love revealed in Him.
