

The Gratitude Attitude

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 Always be joyful. Pray continually and give thanks whatever happens. That is what God wants for you in Christ Jesus.

OK friends this is an honest admission—lately instead of always joyful—I am intermittently joyful. Instead of praying continually—too often it's pray when the "creek rises" when I am in not just in a pinch—but a panic. Instead of giving thanks whatever happens—much of the time it's giving thanks when things come together according to my plan. With these admissions I might also add that winter is very hard on me. I fight harder to stay on top of my emotions—struggle with melancholy—feel closed in, isolated, and sometimes just plain grumpy. You would think by this stage in my life I would have mastered the winter malaise—but this year is yet another reminder that I have not.

Even when circumstances are good some of us know if you look enough and hard enough, you'll find something to bellyache about. So maybe we should quit looking! Lift your eyes off the weeds.

Major in the grace of God. Measure the gifts of God. Collect your blessings. Catalog His kindness.

Assemble your reason for gratitude and recite. "Always be joyful. Pray continually and give thanks whatever happens. That is what God wants for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).

Look at the totality of those terms. Always be joyful, Pray continually. Give thanks whatever happens. Perhaps we learn a lesson from Sidney Connell. When her brand-new bicycle was stolen, she called her dad with the bad news. He expected his daughter to be upset. But Sidney wasn't crying. She was honored. "Dad," she boasted, "out of all the bikes they could have taken they took mine." Gratitude is always an option. And that option makes all the difference even in the midst of Winter Blues. Matthew Henry the great author of Biblical commentaries chose the gratitude option. When the famous scholar was accosted by thieves and robbed of his money bag, he wrote in his diary, "Let me be thankful first, because I was never robbed before; second because, although they took my purse they did not take my life; third although they took my all, it was not much; and, fourthly, because it was I who was robbed not I who did the robbing."

What a difference it makes in life when we make gratitude our default setting, and we find ourselves giving thanks even in the midst of the problems of life.

Psalm 136:1 Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever.

Joel 2:26 You shall eat in plenty and be satisfied and praise the name of the Lord your God who has dealt wondrously with you.

February 11th, following Church. This lunch is for church staff and families and those who were nominated to the Pastoral



This Sunday February 4th Anderson McMahan will be sharing his unique experiences in his mission with the Philadelphia Project which he participated in last Summer. There will be a brief time of questions

following his presentation. Stephen Appleby will continue throughout the remainder of February to focus on the series "Well Versed—Biblical Answers to Todays Toughest Questions."

Beginning Sunday March 3rd Gary Stump will begin a 4-5 week Biblically based class focusing on the Epistle of 2 Peter. 2 Peter is authored by Peter the Apostle/Disciple with particular focus on the grace of God in Christ which empowers Christians to live righteously, even in the face of opposition and persecution.
